

Nepal Flood Aug 26, 2026 - Impacted People Need your Help and Support

On Wednesday morning (local time), 26 August 2026, a catastrophic debris flow and flood was likely triggered by rapid slope failure involving a glacier in Lāntān National Park, Nepal, near the border with China. This debris flow and flooding travelled nearly 100 km and impacted populated areas downstream along the Lende Kholā and Trishulī Kholā rivers, including the Rasuwāgaḍhī border post between China and Nepal. According to current estimate at least 1400 people died and over 6,100 people missing .

The Rivers of the World ROW Foundation members got in touch with the ROW volunteers in Kathmandu to check on the condition of local people impacted by the flood. We received some shocking pictures from them on washed away homes, cars, bridges and people from a few impacted area as shown below.
